of double exposure; that is, the actors go through their part while the scene is filmed, then the film is exposed while the lions, etc. all alone, are walking about in front of a black background.

But in spite of these shams, the actors have often to perform very dangerous and difficult feats. We notice this and we praise them. But how seldom do we think about the camera-man! 'The man behind the gun', as he who works with the camera is some times called, must be brave and daring, quick-witted, and ingenious.

He goes down into the depths of the sea to photograph divers at their work, and to get pictures of the natural life of the ocean bed. Up into the air he soars to get bird's eye view of city and plain. He climbs lofty mountains with the most intrepid explorers, goes into the midst of a battle, and ventures to the brink of seething volcanoes. He must be quick, resourceful, and daring, with the clear eye and the steady nerve of the born adventurer.
